## FAQs

We have developed Lexonik Leap as an accessible and flexible series of activities to help both first language students for whom literacy is very challenging, and students with English as an additional language [EAL], who need to quickly acquire literacy and oracy skills in English. The activities are designed to be adaptive in order to respond to the individual needs of every learner and the initial diagnostic assessment identifies a learning pathway.

### How much is it and what do I get for my money?

Lexonik Leap training is £750 for the first attendee.

- One day of intensive, direct instruction to explain how best to support students with limited skills in English
- Instructional manual
- Activity resource box
- Diagnostic assessment

Additional training places are £400 (additional sets of resources £350).

### How is it used?

- Lexonik Leap can be taught on a 1:1 basis or preferably to groups of 2-4 with students of similar ability. This allows appropriate focus on each individual, while at the same time allowing for interaction and conversation, as well as a competitive element which motivates and keeps students on task throughout.
- Session length is determined by school circumstances, student need and teaching availability – the beauty of Leap is that it can be totally flexible.
- The activities themselves can easily fit into 15-30 minute slots or can be delivered as a full one hour intensive session, whatever suits you and your learners!
- The course can run for as long as is needed for students to acquire any missing knowledge.

### Which age group is it aimed at?

Activities are appropriate for all learners of all ages right through to adulthood.

### Are other resources needed?

No, just a pen and paper! All necessary resources are included.

### How much progress can I expect to see?

This varies depending on the student's needs and time available; delivering intensive one hour daily sessions over a period of one week, students have been able to improve their reading age by 16 months.

### Is there another level?

Lexonik is the next step and is an intense, highly interactive 6 hour programme delivered to groups of 4 over a six week period. It is suitable for students with standardised scores of 85-115 in Key Stages 2 - 5 and is a fantastic way to improve decoding skills, vocabulary knowledge, metacognition and automaticity. It explicitly teaches academic vocabulary, lack of knowledge of which is a primary reason for underachievement of EAL and disadvantaged students. The average reading age gain for the 60,000+ students who have already taken part is 27 months!
